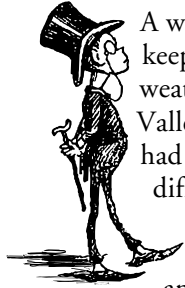
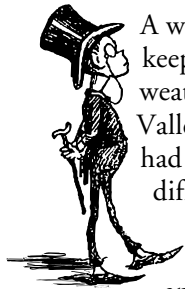


A to Z 2007 VINTAGE



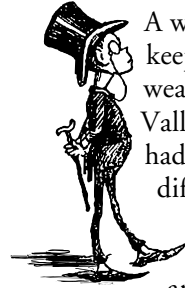

We had great weather for flowering and set a good crop in the Willamette Valley although the Southern Oregon crop was smaller and had a reduction in cluster and berry size. Harvest was difficult with slow picking around storms. For those who kept up with the summer's challenges, contained the disease pressure and waited to pick, there was little rot and some high brix levels in the vineyards. We closed out the harvest in the Willamette Valley on Halloween. Southern Oregon was a different story with great weather and a slow even ripening of epic importance even besting the great 2006 vintage.

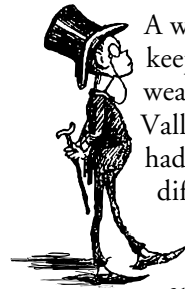
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
